HISTORY OF INSTITUTION

Irinjalakuda Co-operative Hospital is an Ultra Modern Hospital with 250 beds comprising of all the major disciplines of modern medicines with modern facilities and services.

This hospital has all departments of medicines like General Medicine, Surgery, Pediatrics, Orthopedics, Urology, Nephrology, Neurology, Neurosurgery, Gastroenterology, Cardiology, Gynaec and Obstetrics, ENT, Dental and Faciomaxillary Surgery, and Dermatology etc.

All facilities are available for 24hours in trauma care management. All types of X-rays, USG scans and CT scan are available. This hospital is fully equipped with 5 operation theatres with modern equipments. Theatres are for general surgery, neurosurgery, orthopedics', gynaec and obstetrics and also an OT attached to casualty for emergency management.

Our hospital has many ICUs as , Neuro surgery, SICU, Medical ICU &Neo Natal ICU with all sophisticated equipments. Hospital has also have a Neethi optical Store with considerable reduced rates.

N.B. Hospital has 24hours effective treatment for snake bite cases.

SCHOOL OF NURSING

Irinjalakuda Co-operative School of nursing is located in the Irinjalakuda Kodungallur road, at Kolothumpady Junction. The school of nursing started functioning in 2004. The nursing school is owned and governed by Irinjalakuda co-operative hospital, is under the direct management of Co-operative society. The school is recognized by the Kerala Nurses and Midwives Council & Indian Nursing Council.

PROGRAMME OFFERED

Diploma course of 3 years in General Nursing and Midwifery with Community Health Nursing practice in both rural and urban areas. This course entitles the student to the General Nursing and Midwifery certificate awarded by the Kerala Nurses and midwives council and qualifies the student for registration councils of other states to work as a registered nurse and midwife.

AIMS OF SCHOOL OF NURSING

The aims of the diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery program are:

1. To prepare nurses with a sound educational program in nursing to enable them to function as efficient members of the health team.
2. To help nurses develop an ability to Co-operate and Co-ordinate with members of the health team in the prevention of disease, promotion of health and rehabilitation of the sick.
3. To help nurses in their personal and professional development.
4. To serve as a base for further professional education and specialization in nursing.
5. To prepare nurses to keep pace with latest professional and technological developments.

OBJECTIVES OF SCHOOL OF NURSING.

The nurse on completion of this course will be able to :

- Demonstrate competency in providing health care to individual sick or well, using nursing process.
- Assess the nursing need of clients from birth to death.
- Plan and carryout appropriate action to meet nursing needs.
- Promote self care in people under their care.
- Evaluate effectiveness of nursing care.
- Apply problem solving techniques in nursing practice.
- Participate as member of the health team in delivery of curative, preventive, promotive and rehabilitative health care services.
- Recognize the need for continuing education for professional development.
- Demonstrate basic skills in teaching patients and giving nursing care to them.
- Demonstrate basic skills in administration and leadership while working with other members of health team and community.
- Assist in research activities.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Religious and Social life

The institution provides a good religious atmosphere. The students has to participate in the morning prayer held at the hospital everyday The student is also required to participate in activities aimed at communal harmony and social well being.

Vacation

Each student is entitled to avail thirty days annual leave as per KNC subjected to the discretion of the authorities to facilitate the smooth functioning of the school and the hospital.

The student is permitted to take leave other than annual leave with the permission of the authorities only for an emergency situation at home. Parents are required to inform the school authorities if the student is unable to attend school for any reason.

Accommodation and Boarding.

The student has to stay at the nursing school hostel , mess is provided by the hostel. The principal will be in charge of the above.

Eligibility criteria for GNM programme;

1 .Minimum education eligibility criteria for admission to GNM:

- 10+2 with 40% marks from any recognized board. However Science is preferable
- Candidates are also eligible from State Open School recognized by State Government and National Institute of Open School (NIOS) recognized by Central Government.
- Registered ANM
- 10+2 vocational ANM course from the school recognized by Indian Nursing Council
- 10+2 Health care Science – Vocational stream from a recognized CBSE board/State/Centre

For foreign nationals

- The entry qualification equivalency i.e., 12th standard will be obtained by Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi. Institution, State Nursing Council will be responsible to ensure that the qualification and eligibility will be equivalent to what has been prescribed as above

2. Reservation

- a) For disabled candidates: 3% Disability reservation to be considered with a disability of locomotor to the tune of 40% to 50% of the lower extremity and other eligibility criteria with regard to age and qualification will be same as prescribed for each nursing programme.

Note: A committee to be formed consisting of medical officer authorized by medical board of state government and a nursing expert in the panel which may decide whether the candidates have the disability of locomotor of 40% to 50%.

- b) 5% is relaxed for SC/ST candidates
- c) Any other quotas as per the State Govt. under the reservation policy

Note: Quotas shall be applicable within the sanctioned number of the seats sanctioned and not above it.

3. Admission of students shall be once in a year.
4. Students shall be medically fit.
5. Minimum age for admission will be 17 years. (as on 31st December of that year) The upper age limit is 35 yrs. For ANM/ for LHV, there is no age bar.

Fees and Expenses

Registration & Admission	- Rs 500/-
Tuition fee	- Rs.18000/-
Library	- Rs.500/-
Lab	- Rs.500/-

Tuition fees and other fees paid by the student shall not be refunded if the student has to discontinue the course, voluntarily or for disciplinary reasons.

Examination

All students will have to undergo a preliminary training period for the first three months .Regular class tests & term examinations will be conducted by the school of nursing. There will be examinations both in theory and practical by the Kerala Nurses and Midwives council at the end of each year. The awards of the certificate at the completion of the programme will be in accordance with the regulations of the Kerala Nurses and Midwives council, Trivandrum, Kerala.
